They are usually orange with black stripes sometimes white, the black stripes help them camouflage while they are hunting. Two tigers never have the same pattern on their body, all of them are different.

Tigers are nocturnal animals (active at night). Male tigers weigh 90 to 310 Kg and female tigers weigh 65 to 180 Kg. Tigers have muscular bodies with powerful forelimbs, a large head and a tail that is about half the length of its body. Tigers are vertebrates; this means that they have a backbone that supports their body and starts at the skull and ends at the tip of the tail, acting as a flexible central support for the rib cage and limbs.

Tigers are found in many countries like Bangladesh, Vietnam, Cambodia, India, Bhutan, Thailand and many more. The tiger species seems to be 2 million years old according to some Chinese scientists who found a fossil of a tiger which was very old.

Tigers might go extinct in 2030 which is 19 years, there are only 3,900 tigers left world wide. So I hope the government at least try to save the tigers. They are really unique and beautiful creatures.



#### Flamingo



The Flamingo is a beautiful pink wading bird. There are actually 6 different species of Flamingos. They are the Greater Flamingo, Lesser Flamingo, American Flamingo etc. My favourite type is the American Flamingo. It has a scientific name called Phoenicopterus ruber. It is pink in colour, they're feathers are usually pinkish red. They grow as tall as 3 to 5 feet tall and weigh around 5 to 6 pounds.

The males are generally slightly larger than the females. They have pink legs, a pink and white bill with a black tip. The American Flamingo is the only one that lives in the wild in North America. It lives on many Caribbean islands such as the Bahamas and Cuba. It also lives in northern South America, the Galapagos Islands in the Pacific ocean.

Flamingos live in low level water places such as lagoons or lakes. They like to wade around in the water searching for food. They are social and sometimes go in a large group of members like 10,000 birds. The Flamingos get most of their food by filtering out the mud and water in their bills to eat insects and crustaceans like shrimp. They get their pink coloring from the pigment in their food, Carotenoid. Although we mostly think of Flamingos wading in the water, they can fly as well.

They have to run to gather speed before they can take off and they usually fly in flocks. In the cold weather Flamingos can keep one leg next to their body helping it to stay warm.

Flamingos are one of the longest living birds, often living up to 40 years old. For these reasons and many more I am in fond of this beautiful pink bird, Flamingo.

#### **Angels Without Wings**


These words are for our teachers

#### Thomas Jefferson



Thomas Jefferson was born in Shadwell, Virginia, United States, on 13 April 1743. His parents were John Wayles and Jane Randolph. His father was a law-yer, planter and a slave trader and his mother came from a wealthy family, which claimed descent from the kings of Scotland and England.

Jefferson had nine siblings and an adoptive sibling. He went to college at William & Mary in Virginia. Jefferson became a lawyer in 1767. He got married to his cousin Martha Wayles Skelton in 1772. They had six children. He got married again to Sally Heming, they had six children but only four of them survived into adulthood.

Thomas became a member of the Virginia House of Burgesses in 1769. He became president on March 4, 1801 until March 4, 1809. Thomas assumed the post after defeating president John Adams in the 1800 presidential election. He reduced taxes, government spending, and the national debt, and repealed sedition acts.

Thomas Jefferson became sick in 1825 and finally passed away on 4 July 1826. He is remembered even today as the author of the Declaration of American Independence, a document that announced the separation of 13 North American British colonies from Great Britain.



#### **Eels**

Eel is a type of fish which looks like a snake. They have long, narrow bodies with long dorsal, and anal fins. Most eels have no scales. They belong to the order Anguilliformes. There are more than 800 species of eels. Eels live in both saltwater and freshwater.

I know you are so excited to know about it's appearance, right? The colour of an eel is muddy brown and olive brown above. The eel's backbone is made up of over 100 vertebrae which makes it very flexible. Their length ranges from 5cm in the one jawed eel to 4m in the slender giant moray. The shape is elongated with a laterally compressed body. It is similar to a snake while looking. The weight of the adult eels ranges from 30g to 25kg. Eels have gills and very sharp teeth.

Eels are found in Japan, Korea, South America, China and Taiwan. If you want to see eels you can visit any of these countries. Japanese will eat eels in their regular diet. The eel must be cooked thoroughly because its blood is toxic.

Well, you may wonder how long they can live? I will answer it right away. As they live in our century (20 - 21st) We knew them well. Average life span expected for these species is usually 10 - 20 years. Most eels hide and live in caves and rock crevices. They also burrow in the sand. These behaviours allow them to surprise and attack their prey. Some eels will actually chase their prey. The rocks also provide protection for the eel.


The electric eel is a South American freshwater fish found mainly in the Amazon river basin. The electric charge is produced by special organs along the sides of the eel's body. Their bodies contain electric organs with about 6,000 specialized cells called electrocytes that store power like tiny batteries. The electric discharge from an electric eel can be stronger than 500 volts. The eel uses the electric charge against its predators and to catch its prey. They have the power to kill humans like us or to stun a horse with their electricity.

Eels are very unique while comparing to the other fishes. Their dorsal and anal fins are fused with the coudal fin, forming a single ribbon, which is running along their full body. Eels swim by generating waves which travel their full body length. Some species of eels travel up to 4,000 miles to breed. This journey can take the eel over seven months to finish. While on the journey, the eel doesn't eat anything. After the eel breeds, it dies. It takes a young eel three years to become an adult.

Eels are one of the most amazing creatures in the world. It has so many unique features like its structure, its style of catching prey, its breeding style, etc. An unbelievable thing that I felt about eels is that, it can discharge electricity more than 500 volts and it is enough to kill a human.




#### God's Signature



They were facing lots of problems to do transportation so I gave them a idea to use the logs of wood , the wheel apparently was born!




Now I can happily say I'm from the Neolithic era!


