Blue Whale

Blue whale is a colossal marine mammal. They grow to be about 30 meters long. The biggest blue whale found was 190 tons and measured 98 feet long.



Blue whales have lungs which they can breathe. Blue whale lungs can hold more than 1,000 gallons (3,785.4L) of air. Blowholes at the top of its head, spray air and condensed water vapor 30 feet (9.1 m) into the air.

Blue whales eat tiny crustaceans called krill. They are huge but their throats are small. It's esophagus is only inches wide, making it impossible to swallow anything big. In addition, blue whales lack teeth and must swallow their food whole.

Blue whales have thick fat tissue called blubber in the down of their skin that insulates them from cold temperatures. Since blubber is not as dense as water, it provides buoyancy and makes it easier for blue whales to float and swim.

Blue whales can be found in depths of each and every ocean except Arctic. Evidence suggests that the blue whales in certain areas might not migrate at all.

Do you know who wrote the national anthem of Bangladesh and India? He is the 1st Indian to receive the Nobel prize. He is best known poet. He was popularly called as Guru dev. He is Rabindranath Tagore.

Rabindranath Tagore was born on 7 may 1861 in Kolkata. His father was Debendranath Tagore and his mother was Sarada Devi. As a child, Tagore lived amidst an atmosphere where literary magazines were published, musical recitals were held, and theatre was performed. Tagore wrote his first poem when he was 8 years old. In 1877, when he was 16, Tagore published his first large poetry collection. Rabindranath Tagore was educated in Brighton, East Sussex, England, at a public school.



Tagore wrote our National Anthem song on 11 December 1911. He also wrote Bangladesh national anthem in 1905. He received the Nobel prize literature 1913 for his collection Gitanjali published in London in 1912.

The poet was awarded the Nobel Prize in 1913. He was the first Indian to receive the honor from the Swedish Academy. He was also the first Asian to win it.

I think Rabindranath Tagore is an amazing poet because he was certainly a man of many talents. He wrote many poems.

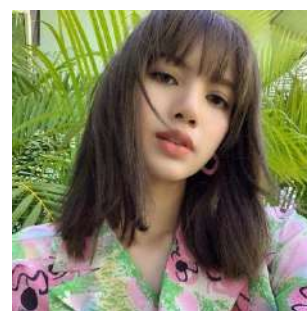
Lisa A Biography

Biography—Ariana Grande

“Know your truth. No one can ever take that away from you.” - Ariana Grande. Let me ask you a question, Who is your favourite singer? Many say, Ariana Grande, more than anyone else.

Ariana Grande-Butera was born on June 26, 1993, in Boca Raton, Florida. She began singing and acting when she was young. In 2008 Grande won a role in the Broadway play 13. She soon began appearing in a few parts of television shows.

An American pop singer and actress Ariana Grande burst into the music scene in the early 2010s. Ariana increased her popularity with the power of social media. She connects with her fans through posts on Twitter, YouTube, Instagram, and other platforms. Her huge break came in when she was cast as Cat Valentine on the television series Victorious. She played a teenager attending a performing arts school in the situation comedy. Ariana was on the show until Nickelodeon cancelled it in 2013. After that, she starred in the spin-off show Sam & Cat, which aired from 2013 to 2014.

While pursuing her acting career, she had also been perfecting her singing. She released a single, “Put Your Hearts Up,” in 2011. Since then, Ariana decided to concentrate completely on her music. In 2013 she released the album “Yours Truly”. It highlighted the popular single “The Way,” a collaboration with rapper Mac Miller. It debuted at number 10 on the Billboard Top 100 chart.

Her second album “My Everything” was released in 2014. It starred in collaborations with singers like The Weekend, Iggy Azalea, and Childish Gambino. The album, as well as the song “Bang Bang” featuring Jessie J and Nicki Minaj, which led Grande to earn her first Grammy Award nomination (an award given to singers who sing very well).

Grande’s third album, Dangerous Woman was released in 2016. This once again included collaborations with well-known musicians, such as Lil’ Wayne and Minaj. Grande began a Dangerous Woman tour in 2017. In May of that year, a suicide bomber killed more than 20 people at a field after her concert in Manchester, England. Ariana subsequently organized a benefit concert to raise funds for people who were affected by the attack. Stars participating in the benefit concert included Katy Perry, Justin Bieber, and Miley Cyrus.

Like two of her three previous albums, Sweetener (her next album) reached number one on the Billboard 200 chart. Dangerous Woman had peaked at number two. Sweetener included the songs “God Is a Woman,” “No Tears Left to Cry,” and “The Light Is Coming” featuring Minaj. Sweetener won the award for the best pop vocal album in the 2019 Grammys. Grande released the album Thank U, in 2019. The title track, as well as such songs as “Ghostin” and “7 Rings,”. It included glimpses into her personal life. Grande released her sixth studio album, Positions, in 2020. She won her second Grammy Award (presented in early 2021), for best pop duo group performance, for her collaboration with Lady Gaga on the song “Rain on Me” (2020).

In November 2019, Grande announced her support for Senator Bernie Sanders's second presidential bid. Grande began a relationship with real estate agent Dalton Gomez in January 2020. The couple became engaged that December. They married in mid-May 2021. Ariana has 9 dogs and a pet pig called "Piggy Smallz", who is an emotional support animal.

So, on a scale from 1 to 10, I would give Ariana a 20. As she is a beautiful and amazing singer. With an astonishing vocal voice.

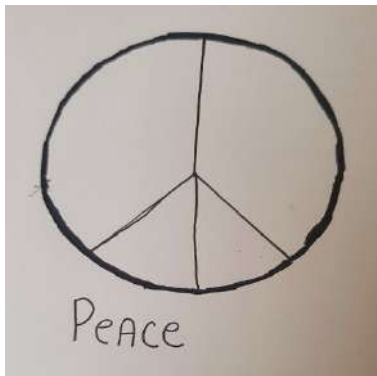

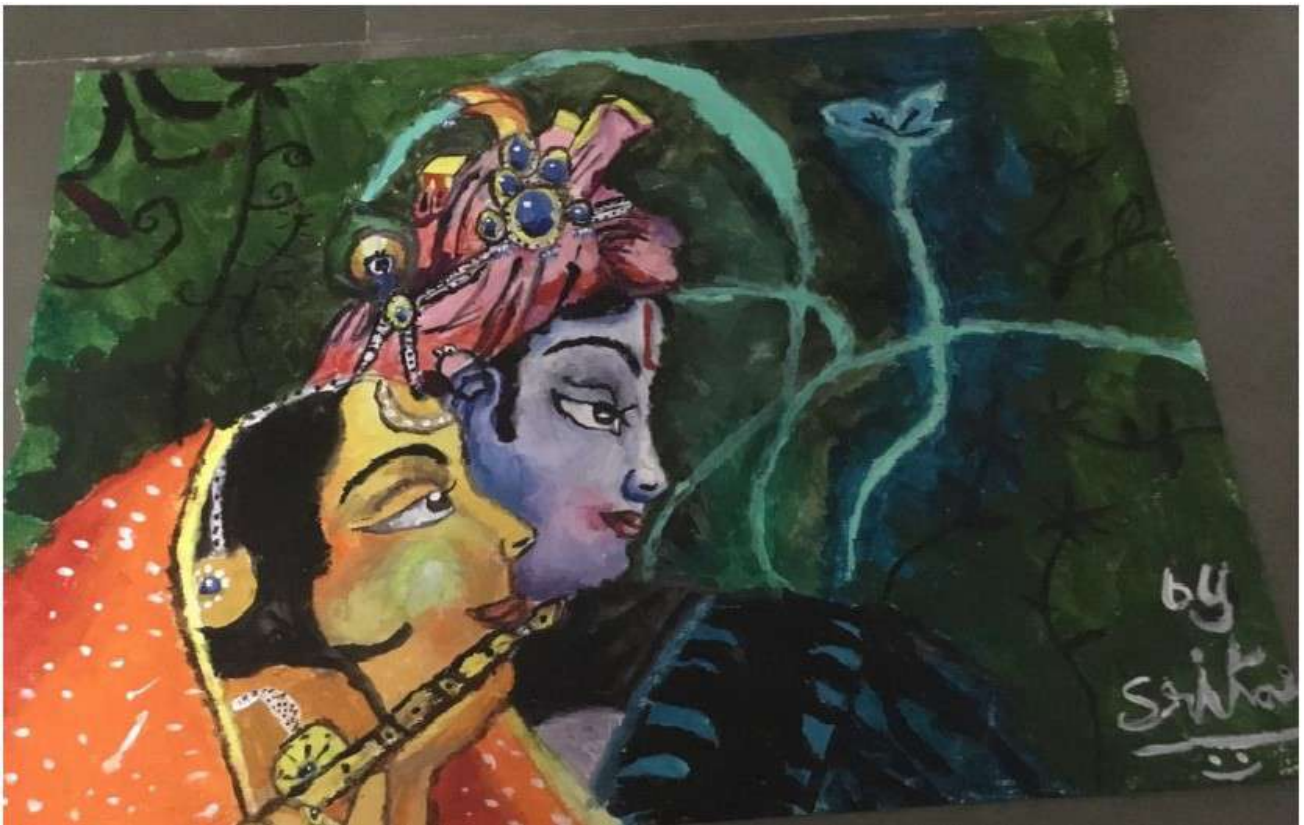

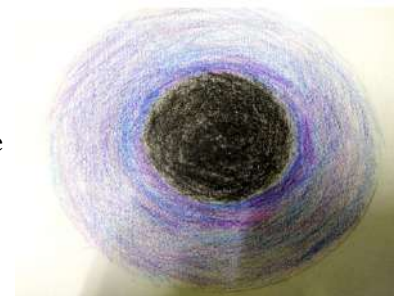
The Black hole

A television never makes people feel alone. Most of my life when ever I was alone at home, I'd switch on the T.V and I would feel safe.

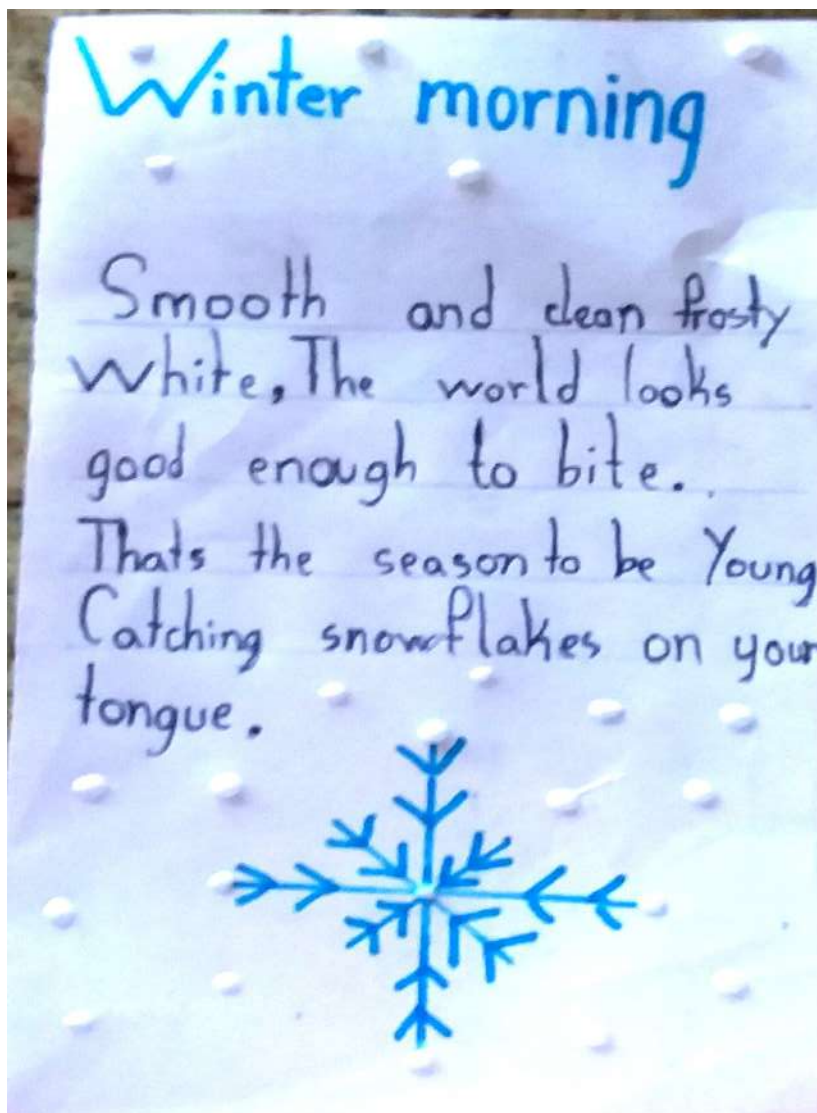

My Favourite animal is a Seahorse. Seahorses are tiny fishes that are named for the shape of their head, which looks like the head of a tiny horse. You'll find seahorses in the world's tropical and temperate coastal waters, swimming upright among seaweed and other plants. Seahorses use their dorsal fins (back fins) to propel slowly forward.

To move up and down, seahorses adjust the volume of air in their swim bladders, which is an air pocket inside their bodies. Tiny, spiny plates cover seahorses' bodies all the way down to their curled, flexible tails. A female seahorse lays dozens, sometimes hundreds, of eggs in a pouch on the male seahorse's abdomen.

Called a brood pouch, it resembles a kangaroo's pouch for carrying young. Seahorse young hatch after up to 45 days in the brood pouch. The tail can grasp objects, helpful when seahorses want to anchor themselves to vegetation. The baby seahorses, each about the size of a jelly bean, find other baby seahorses and float together in small groups, clinging to each other using their tails. Unlike kangaroos, baby seahorses do not return to the pouch.

They must find food and hide from predators as soon as they're born. Seahorses can move their eyes independently of each other! Although the seahorse is not a true mystical or magical creature, it is certainly a unique and amazing one. It is alarming to think that this wonderful fish may not survive for future generations to experience, to study, and to simply be amazed by.

Awareness of the present endangerment of seahorses must be shared, and preservation efforts must become effective now in order to protect the seahorse. The seahorse is a magnificent creature and is extremely interesting. Their mating customs, intriguing habitat, and engrossing lifestyle make them one of the most fascinating animals in the whole ocean. Do you think seahorses are one of the most fantastic sea creatures that exist?

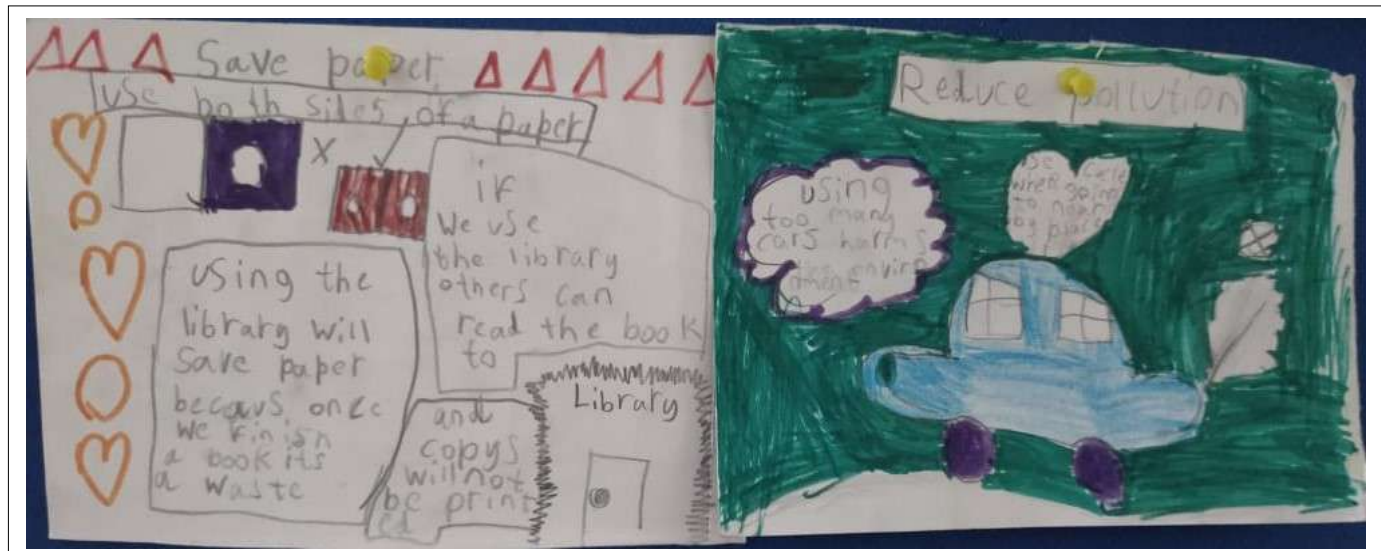

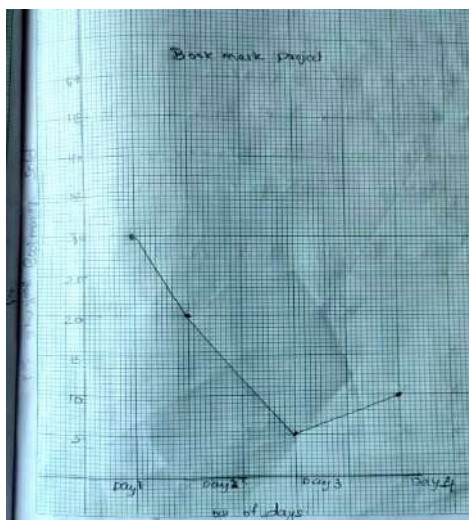
Siddhant
